Sunday, November 3rd - All day hike on the Long Trail from Rt. 242 (Jay-Montgomery Center Road) to Rt. 58 (Hazen's Notch). Bring trail lunch. This is a 7.1 mile hike and will leave from Montpelier High School at 8:00 a.m. For other information, call leader.

Saturday, November 16th - Green Mountain Audubon Nature Center, Huntington. This is a nature preserve at the foot of the west side of Camel's Hump. Sunday, December 1st - Blue Ridge Mountain. This 3,295 foot mountain is located to the west of the Long Trail and north of Rt. 4 near Rutland. The Green Mountain Club maintains the 2.4 mile Cauty Trail which begins on the Old Turnpike Road one-half mile from Route 4. The trail crosses several brooks. From the summit may be had extensive views of Pico and other peaks of the Coolidge Range, Stratton, Dorset, Herrick and Bird Mountains nearby, and the Adirondacks on the horizon. Bring a trail lunch and possibly snowshoes may be needed.
