MIDDLESEX NOTCH

A leisurely Sunday afternoon walk along an old woods road with beaver dams along the way and a pretty view. Leave Montpelier at 1:30 P.M.

MOUNT WEBSTER
MOUNT JACKSON

These peaks, the most southerly of the seven peaks of the range extending SW from Mount Washington can be ascended either from Crawford's, the trails starting in common and afterwards dividing, or by the Webster Cliff Trail. The views along the cliffs of Mount Webster are such that anyone with a normal appreciation of the grandeur of mountain scenery will add at least 2 hrs. for their enjoyment; there is nothing finer in the White Mountains - so says the Guide Book. About 6 miles. Leave Montpelier at 7:00 A.M.

ADAMS APPLE
Mt. Mansfield

Up via Bear Pond Trail which includes steepest half mile of trail to be found in Vermont. From ridge striking views of cliffs rising from Smugglers' Notch and of the peaks of the Sterling Range beyond. Down via Hell Brook Trail, next to the Bear Pond Trail the steepest of the Green Mt. trails and one of the most interesting. For experienced hikers only. Leave Montpelier at 9:00 A.M.

MOUNT HORRID

North of Vt. 73 (the Brandon-Rochester Highway in Brandon Gap) the Long Trail crosses a power line and ascends steeply to the Great Cliff of Mount Horrid. This point, 700 feet above the road, provides a fine view of the Gap and the mountains beyond. The Trail continues along the ridge to Mt. Horrid. 1.2 miles from road to summit. Leave Montpelier at 8:00 A.M.
